


# February Newsletter 2022 "Christ in our heads, our hearts and our hands"

#### Dear Parents,

The children are continuing to work hard and respond positively to their learning. We have been reviewing our approach to the teaching of phonics and will be organisng a workshop for parents in the KS1 classes before half term. We will continue to monitor the provision of phonics and early reading and share progress with you at our next parents meetings.

Furthermore the children will be participating in the Ten Ten Year of Pilgrimage during our Friday assemblies. We will be taking the children on an exciting virtual pilgrimage journey in school from February through to December 2022. The children will be 'stopping' at key destinations across the year such as the cross, Santiago de Compostela, Rome, a local pilgrimage site, Walsingham, Lourdes and lastly the manger in December 2022. ## Reflection for the month of February



The month of February is dedicated to the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In Luke's gospel we're told the Holy Family went each year to the temple for the feast

of Passover. Jesus was obedient to his mother and father and Mary and Joseph showed their obedience and faith, praying together throughout their lives. Through prayer we too can become a holy family.

Ask the children to share their favourite prayer with you.

### The Power of Prayer



In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus teaches the Lord's Prayer after one of the disciples asks, "Lord, teach us to pray." Jesus taught his disciples how to pray and so gives us a model for prayer.

I have asked the children to write their own prayers for our weekly prayer service and place them in the prayer basket. We will then share these prayers with each other and offer them to the Lord.
